Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures:
No action shall be taken involving any personal risk or without suitable training
Wear protective clothes giving a total skin protection, latex gloves, safety glasses and dustmask
Keep away from the affected area people not involved in the emergency intervention.
Avoid dust generation.
Dusts at sufficient concentrations can form explosive mixtures with air
Avoid any accumulation of electrostatic charge which may create a hazardous condition and cause an ignition.
Environmental precautions:

Precautions for safe handling:
Operate in well-ventilated areas.
As for all powdery organic products, avoid the accumulation of powders in the air to prevent formation of explosive mixtures. Avoid any accumulation of electrostatic charge which may create a hazardous condition and cause an ignition.
Always respect hygienic rules.
Avoid eye and skin contact; avoid powder inhalation. Use self-protective equipment. Remove all contaminated clothing and wash them before reuse.
Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities
Keep in the original containers tightly closed in a well-ventilated place far from humidity, heat source and direct sunlight.
